## **Ethical Humanism and Unitarian Universalism in a Time of Decision**

**Albert Einstein once said, "What the world needs most is an ethical culture." In his writings, Albert Schweitzer saw only three prospects for the future: world dictatorship, nuclear annihilation, or the emergence of a democratic humanism.**

**What would this mean, and how can the humanistic ideal be achieved? There are several Humanist and Ethical Societies, and there is the much larger Unitarian Universalist Association, but the question is whether they can stem a downwards spiraling movement of society.**

**Our speaker, Reverend Joseph Ben-David, who has witnessed some of the dramatic events of the 20th century, is a life-long humanist unitarian activist who has served in many key organizational positions. He will present an analysis of forces that could prevent or advance the realization of the humanistic vision in this time of ultimate decision.**
